Acceptance Package	Confirmation of acceptance to the University of Nevada, Reno is sent immediately, provided the student has properly completed the application form and has submitted all the required supporting documents. An admissions packet will be issued and sent to the sponsoring institution, unless otherwise requested.

Health Insurance Requirements	<p>Exchange students must have health insurance coverage, or purchase the University insurance which is an annual fee of \$1,700.00.*</p>
Facilities	<p>The university dining hall, school library, athletic facilities, etc. are open to exchange students holding a student ID Card (Wolf Card).</p>
Student Services	<p>All student services, clubs and organizations are open to exchange students. These include but are not limited to, writing center, tutoring, math, knowledge center, student union and much more!</p>
Course Availability/Registration for Exchange Students	<p>Generally, students can take any course listed in the <a href="#">catalog</a> provided they meet all prerequisites and of appropriate level. International exchange students should refer to <a href="#">MyNEVADA</a> to check course availability and schedules. If waiving prerequisites, students will be directed to an academic advisor based on their major. Requirements may vary by department and the process to waive prerequisites can take time therefore students should plan ahead as much as possible. <b><i>Special Note for the College of</i></b></p>



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	<p><b><i>Business – there is a very high demand for courses in the College of Business. <p>Language Requirements for Exchange Students (Both Undergraduate and Graduate)</p>	<p>Verification of having met the English requirement through one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) score of 61 undergraduate/79 graduate (iBT-Internet-Based Test) or 500 undergraduate/550 graduate (Paper-Based Test). International English Language Testing System (IELTS - must be academic version) with an equivalency score of 6 undergraduate/6.5 graduate. Please indicate 'Institution Code 4844' and 'Undergraduate 00' to Educational Testing Service (ETS) to ensure</li> </ul>



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	<p>that the scores are sent directly to UNR. Copies of scores sent directly from the sending institution are acceptable.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Receive recommendation for academic study from the Intensive English Language Center (IELC) at UNR.</li></ul> <p><u>EXEMPTION:</u> Please note that students coming from the following English-speaking countries are exempt from the English language testing requirements: Antigua/Barbuda, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Bermuda, British Guyana, British Virgin Islands, Canada (except for Quebec), Ghana, Ireland, Jamaica, Kenya, New Zealand, Nigeria, Singapore, St. Lucia, St. Kitts &amp; Nevis, St. Vincent, Trinidad &amp; Tobago, United Kingdom, and Zimbabwe.</p>
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
